LEGISLATION



Good day all. As you are aware the situation at our Texas border has gotten worse and continues to be ignored by the Administration. Gov. Abbott has stepped up to protect Texas Citizens and the property owners near the border. Previously, we had to face the Del Rio crisis whereby over 14,000 illegal immigrants camped and were eventually dispersed. Some sources indicate that these people were secretly loaded onto planes and covertly flown to various states, (mostly red), by the federal government rather than refuse them entrance to the US as per our current laws. As it stands today, another caravan of illegals is headed our way and said to contain people from numerous countries and as far away as Nigeria and China. Gov. Abbott has now deployed the Texas National Guard and other resources to our Texas border to protect our citizens. The cartels continue to ramrod the influx of these people into our state, including advertising on Tik Tok and other social media to entice US teens to smuggle in illegals by offering thousands of dollars in payments. Illegal drug use and sex trafficking have increased, and logic would dictate, are related to the Border Crisis.

The third special session just ended, and it produced laws on hot topics as follows:

Redistricting new political maps (litigation is already underway to challenge this), Restricting transgender student athletes from playing on sports teams that align with their gender identity, and how to spend the approximately \$13 to \$16 billion in federal covid relief funds. The Legislature was unable to pass laws to prohibit business from mandating vaccines or increase the penalties for election fraud. Gov. Abbott’s executive order banning vaccine mandates is still in effect.

The areas for spending the \$13 to 16 billion in federal covid relief funds include \$7.2 billion to the state’s unemployment compensation fund, \$2 billion for surge staffing at hospitals and the operation of regional infusion centers, over \$500 million for broadband infrastructure, and approximate \$3.3 billion to [higher education institutions across the state for capital construction projects](#).

The Legislature did briefly address the property taxes that we face as Texas residents. They have agreed to put a constitutional amendment to the voters in May to raise the state’s homestead exemption for school district property taxes from \$25,000 to \$40,000. For the average Texas homeowner, that is about \$176 in savings on their property tax bill.

There are no plans for a fourth Special Session at this time due to “exhaustion” but pressure is building to have the legislators return to Austin to reconsider the voter integrity situation among other topics.

If any of you had the opportunity to listen to the Congressional hearings regarding AG Merritt Garland and the DOJ’s handling of our country’s school boards, you would be very impressed with our Republican Senators, including Tom Cotton, Josh Hawley, and Ted Cruz. They have demanded that Garland resign, and he should. My hope is that all elected Republican leaders at the Federal level and at the State level can follow this example and Stand Together for the sake of our rights, our freedoms, and our country. God Bless Texas and the USA.

ROCKWALL COUNTY UPDATE



As you are aware, this past Tuesday was Election Day. All voters throughout Rockwall County had 8 State of Texas propositions or constitutional amendments on their ballot as well as \$150,000,000 bond proposal for road improvements throughout the county. If you live within the boundaries of Rockwall ISD, you had 2 bond proposals to consider as well. The first was \$458,926,000 for facilities and the second was \$16,919,000 for technology equipment. All 8 of the State of Texas propositions were approved statewide and in Rockwall County. All 3 of the bond proposals passed as well with 61.2 percent supporting the road bonds, 51.5 percent in support of the bonds for facilities and 51.33 percent in support of the technology bond issuance.

This was the first election after being approved as requested by the Rockwall County Commissioners Court for County Wide Polling by the Texas Secretary of State. Quite simply, any voter in Rockwall County could cast their ballots on Election Day at any of the 12 polling locations. It is a more efficient use of personnel and equipment and most importantly, much easier for all voters.

With the release of the official census data, the Texas Legislature completed the difficult task of congressional, state senate and state house redistricting. The good news for Rockwall County is we didn't change districts and will remain in Congressional District 4, State Senate District 2, and Texas House District 33.

As a result of the tremendous amount of growth in Rockwall County, commissioner's precinct boundaries as well as justice of the peace and constable boundaries are required to be adjusted as well. We have completed this process and the court approved map will be posted on the Rockwall County Website.

It truly is an honor serving as the Rockwall County Judge. You are always more than welcome to call or email me or simply stop by my office. SREC UPDATE



The Texas Legislature adjourned on Tuesday, October 19. They passed redistricting maps, which is a Constitutional requirement, but left other things on Governor Abbott's agenda unaccomplished.

The Republican Party of Texas is respectfully requesting Governor Abbott call a fourth special session to complete the following:

1. Restore stiffer penalties for illegal voting that were lowered in SB1. This was previously added to the Third Special Session.
2. A full forensic audit of Texas elections to ensure illegal voting is rooted out and prosecuted.
3. A ban on all vaccine mandates, as previously added to the call on Oct. 11.

- 4. Banning gender modification, including cross sex hormone treatment and puberty blockers, as outlined in the Legislative Priorities of the RPT.

State Chair Matt Rinaldi formed a Special Committee for Vaccine Mandates. The committee released a second open letter from the SREC to Governor Abbott, requesting a fourth session to pass legislation to ban vaccine mandates. The committee notes that many businesses are defying the governor’s executive order and Texans who choose not to become vaccinated are losing their jobs. All Texans are urged to sign the letter to help us ask Governor Abbott for a fourth special session to pass vaccine mandate ban legislation, specifically HB 168, and pass our other legislative priorities.


SENATE DISTRICT 2




It is that time of the decade again—redistricting. As is required by our Texas Constitution, the Legislature must redraw the boundaries of our Congressional, House, Senate, and State Board of Education (SBOE) districts to reflect the changes in population Texas has experienced in the previous decade. Some of these changes are minor, however, some are significant, which is why I feel it is appropriate to go over what is happening to Senate District 2 (SD 2) with you. First let’s discuss the requirements. Where congressional districts must be drawn to maintain equal population, Texas legislative districts must be within a +/- 5% range of the ideal population, which is now 940,178 persons. Districts cannot be drawn to discriminate against race, however certain districts must be drawn to ensure minority populations have an opportunity to elect the candidate of their choice. Districts must be contiguous, and in the case of the House districts cannot break apart counties unless necessary to meet the population requirements.

SD 2 as is, was nearly perfect, with a population of 944,576 people, or a deviation from the ideal of only 0.5%. As great as it would have been to just leave the district as it is, the unfortunate reality is that our neighboring districts saw much greater changes, requiring adjustments to be made in order to conform their districts to the legal requirements.

Below, the area in grey is the current SD 2 that has been in use for elections in the past decade.



Below, the grey area is the newly approved SD 2.



As you can see in the images above, SD 2 will take on some major changes. To start, I am sad to report that the district is parting ways with Delta, Fannin, Hunt, Hopkins, and Rains counties, as well as some parts of Dallas County. While those of you who live in areas that will be moved to other districts will be obtaining new senators, know that I will continue to fight for the rights and liberties of all Texans, regardless of where you live. I am pleased to welcome to the SD 2 family the residents of Ellis and Navarro counties as well as some new precincts in Dallas and Collin counties. Know that my staff and I will strive to see that you are represented in Austin and that the Government continues to work for you.

While the above map is what has been passed by the legislature, we now enter the time-honored tradition of Texas's maps being challenged in court. While there is no guarantee anything will change, I will be sure to keep you updated if any litigation affects SD 2.

Monoclonal Antibody Therapy Information

There is a relatively little-known but widely available treatment for COVID-19 that is safer, more effective, and already available to many individuals: monoclonal antibody therapy. This therapeutic is available at both private and government locations, and is always completely free at the latter. You and your family members should be aware of this treatment option, which can be life-saving and keep you out of the hospital.

Monoclonal antibody therapy is a COVID-19 treatment option available to certain Texans who either have the illness, or who are at an exceptionally high risk of becoming ill. It works by infusing COVID-19 antibodies into a patient's bloodstream. These antibodies target the coronavirus spike protein, resulting in a hindrance of the virus' ability to adhere to and infect cells, therefore boosting the immune system's response to COVID-19 and slowing the infection.

Monoclonal antibody therapy requires a prescription, but if you do not have a regular healthcare provider, you may call 1-877-332-6585 to speak with the Combat COVID-19 Monoclonal Antibodies Call Center for further direction.

You qualify for monoclonal antibody therapy if:

1. You have tested positive for COVID-19, and
2. You have had mild to moderate symptoms of the disease for 10 days or less, and
3. You are at high risk of becoming seriously ill. Criteria for being high risk can include being overweight, pregnant, diabetic, etc.

In addition, you must also be at least 12 years of age, and must weigh at least 88 pounds. You may also be able to qualify for monoclonal antibody treatment without a positive COVID-19 test if:

1. You are not fully vaccinated or don't have enough protection from the vaccine, and
2. You have been in close contact with someone who has COVID-19.

According to testimony at a recent Texas Senate hearing, monoclonal antibodies are safe and highly effective. An online map of infusion centers available to the public may be found at <https://meds.tdem.texas.gov/>. There are presently 24 state-sponsored infusion centers, and nearly 400 private locations. The treatment is completely free at state-sponsored locations. At the private locations, Medicare/Medicaid and some insurance policies will cover the cost.

The number for the Infusion Hotline is 1-800-742-5990. You may call this hotline to set up an appointment with a state center, or to ask about the option of having a mobile infusion team deployed to help.

ON THE CONCLUSION OF THE THIRD CALLED SPECIAL SESSION**



AUSTIN, TEXAS -- State Rep. Justin Holland said Tuesday that he is pleased with the results of the most recent special session along with the legislative accomplishments of the 87th legislative session.

“After a unique and challenging regular session and three special called sessions - we can pause and reflect on the strides that we’ve made in the great State of Texas in 2021,” Holland said.

Texas Republicans teamed up in a series of marathon sessions lasting nearly 10 months to deliver a host of results for Texans and Texas values. Those accomplishments of the most recent special session include:

- The passage of the **redistricting** maps for Congress, the Texas Senate, the Texas House and the State Board of Education.
- The passage of key **property tax relief** benefiting all Texans with an increase to the homestead exemption (from \$25,000 to \$40,000) and senior citizens.
- The appropriation of federal funds to **bolster COVID-19 recovery** and provide for various needs due to the pandemic via the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).
- The passage of legislation that **strengthens Higher Education** in Texas via tuition revenue bonds.

Previous to the third called session during the regular and second called session, the GOP-led Texas legislature:

- Passed a **conservative biennial budget**;

- Passed a \$1.8 billion **border security** package
- **Saved the lives of the unborn** and protected the sanctity of life;
- Upheld the **2nd amendment rights** of Texans;
- Passed a sweeping **election integrity** package;
- Protected **religious freedoms** and family values;
- Tackled critical issues and reformed the **Texas power grid**;
- Prioritized legislation that backs our state and municipal **police** forces;
- Honored our commitments to Texas' **retired teachers**;
- Passed a **bail reform** package to keep violent criminals off the streets; and,
- Instituted various **health care** reforms such as **telehealth**, telemedicine, **teledentistry** and prescription cost-saving programs.

The Texas Legislature meets every odd-numbered year for 140 days in a regular session. The next scheduled session is January of 2023.
