We are so honored to have former Justice Wanda Fowler of the Fourteenth Court of Appeals as our Guest Speaker.

Wanda Fowler was a Justice on the Fourteenth Court of Appeals for almost 14 years before joining Wright Close & Barger, LLP as a partner. While on the Court she authored approximately 1900 opinions and decided approximately 3,800 more cases. In 2001, the other members of the Court elected her Acting Chief Justice for five months pending an appointment of a new chief justice and, in 2003, the Houston Chapter of the Texas Association of Civil Trial and Appellate Specialists voted her Appellate Judge of the Year. She is a frequent speaker at Continuing Legal Education Seminars. Before joining the Court, Ms. Fowler was a commercial litigator in private practice, and was in-house legal counsel for GTE Mobilnet.

Ingredients:

2 tablespoons butter
large yellow onions sliced
2 cloves garlic minced
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon cinnamon
½ teaspoon nutmeg
½ teaspoon ground ginger
2 15 - ounce cans pumpkin puree
2 cups chicken stock
2 cups water
½ cup heavy cream



Directions:

Melt the butter in large pot over medium heat.
Add sliced onions to the pan and cook stirring occasionally until caramelized, about 15 minutes.
Add the garlic, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg, and ginger to the onions and stir constantly for one minute.
Add ¼ cup of the chicken stock and use wooden spoon to scrape
Add the remaining chicken broth, water, and pumpkin puree and stir to combine.
Turn heat to low and simmer the soup for 20 minutes.
Turn the stove off and use a handheld immersion blender to puree the soup. Alternately, use a regular blender and puree the soup in 2-3 batches.
Stir the heavy cream into the soup, serve immediately with warm bread if desired.

STATE REPUBLICAN EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE SD 2



On September 7 I attended a Border Summit in Austin. We listened to eight border experts describe the situation at the border. We are being invaded. Fentanyl and human trafficking are the issues.

Thank you, County Judge David Sweet for signing the Declaration of Invasion. Also, thank you to Sheriff Terry Garrett, County Commissioners Cliff Sevier and Janet Nichols, and Rockwall County Republican Hispanic Club President Edna Sullivan for their support of the declaration.

I was in Austin on September 22-24 for our State Republican Executive Committee quarterly meeting. I was appointed Chair of the Partnerships and Coalitions Committee. My committee is in charge of keeping track of our partnerships. We are in the process of updating the website with the correct contact information. The Texas Federation of Republican Women is one of our partners. Dr. Dana Meyers, State Vice Chair, gave a report on what is happening with TFRW and how they are helping with our election. I am also a member of the Resolutions Committee. The following resolutions were passed by the SREC:

A resolution honoring the Life of Chris McDonald. He was the Senate District 6 State Republican Executive Committee since 2014.

A resolution to Enforce Republican Party of Texas Platform Plank 234. The RPT calls on the Texas Senate Republican Caucus and the Texas House Republican Caucus to include the 2022-23 Legislative Priorities of the RPT as they prepare their respective Legislative Priorities.

A resolution restoring the Sovereignty of Texas and the integrity of the Mexican Border.

A resolution that the RPT condemns the August 8, 2022 FBI raid on Donald J. Trump's home.

A resolution that the Republican majority means Republican control. The RPT declares its support of the legislative priority regarding ending the practice of granting chairmanships of legislative committees to Democrat members of the Texas Legislature.

A resolution in support of the due process rights of the January 6, 2021 protestors.

A resolution that contingent upon the endorsement of the Collin County Republican Executive Committee, the RPT endorses the Republican candidates for Princeton ISD and Wylie ISD.

A resolution that contingent upon the endorsement of the Travis County Republican Party, the RPT endorses the Republican candidates for Round Rock ISD.

A resolution to support parents, schools, and districts in rejecting harmful, coercive, and burdensome gender identity policies and protect school lunch programs and federal funding subject to Title IX. The RPT declares its unequivocal opposition to the proposed regulatory changes released by the U>S> Department of Education on June 23, 2022. And the RPT supports the lawsuit filed by Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton and 21 other state Attorney Generals seeking to invalidate the newly enacted assistance and other funding subject to Title IX to the adoption of gender identity policies.

Mark your calendars for May 22-24, 2024 for our Republican State Convention in San Antonio.

It is critical that we (Republicans) all vote R all the way down. I challenge all Republicans to take at least two voters to the polls.



LEGISLATIVE



It The 88th Legislative Session begins in January and TFRW's biennial Legislative Day will be held at the AT&T Conference Center in Austin on Friday, February 3rd, 2023. I and all the TFRW Board hope that you will join us in Austin for the fun and facts we will be sharing on February 2nd and 3rd. More information will be coming out soon about the FUN on Thursday before the FACTS on Friday. We anticipate opening registration in early December.

My goal for Legislative Day is to fully prepare you to participate in Texas' 88th Legislative Session. You work hard to elect Republican legislators, now you need the tools and training to be the most effective activist you can be.

We selected Friday for our day of training because many representatives return to their districts on Friday for the weekend, and we want you to have the opportunity

to see them on Thursday. Be watching for more information about Thursday's activities at the Capitol. If you can't make it on Thursday, there will be several representatives joining us on Friday for Legislative Day.

In the 87th session, TFRW had three legislative priorities that kept us very busy: Election on matters related to Election Integrity and Education. It is presumed that multiple bills will be introduced in these two categories including tweaking SB1 (Election Integrity bill), school choice, additional legislation prohibiting Critical Race Theory (CRT) legislation relating to textbooks and library books, legislation relating to athletics in our schools, and a Parent's Bill of Rights. With more than 5,000 bills filed in a legislative session, there will be a lot of activity and plenty for us to follow. Please watch for my TFRW Action Alerts as they often contain time-sensitive information.

There are many other organizations including the Republican Party of Texas that have adopted their own legislative priorities you may want to support. To the extent that our priorities overlap, we will work together to attain our goals. And, of course, you likely will have your own legislative priorities that are personal to you. Our training is intended to prepare you to stay up-to-date on the bills that interest you the most and to teach you how to submit testimony on a bill or testify live at a committee hearing.

Preparing members to participate in the legislative process is just another way that TFRW builds strong leaders! Integrity, Education and Redistricting. For the 88th session, TFRW will continue its focus.
