LEGISLATION



The 87th legislative session lasted nearly 10 months including the regular session and three special sessions. The accomplishments include the following: Passed a conservative biennial budget. Passed a \$1.8 billion border security package. Saved the lives of the unborn and protected the sanctity of life. Upheld the 2nd amendment rights of Texans. Passed a sweeping election integrity package. Protected religious freedoms and family values. Tackled critical issues and reformed the Texas power grid. Prioritized legislation that backs our state and municipal police forces. Honored our commitments to Texas' retired teachers. Passed a bail reform package to keep violent criminals off the streets. Instituted various health care reforms such as telehealth, telemedicine, tele-dentistry and prescription cost-saving programs.

Texas lawmakers have redrawn political maps for the state's congressional, House, Senate and Board of Education districts and it was signed into law by our governor. Other accomplishments are Property tax relief with an increase to the homestead exemption from \$25,000 to \$40,000 and senior citizens; The appropriation of federal funds to bolster COVID-19 recovery and various needs; and the passage of legislation that strengthens Higher Education in Texas via tuition revenue bonds. The next scheduled session of the Texas Legislature is January of 2023.



My Employer Wants Me to Get the Vaccine - Now What?

More and more employees across the state of Texas and our nation are facing COVID-19 vaccine mandates thrust upon them by their employers. Being faced with the choice to either take a vaccine you don't want, or to lose your livelihood, is a position no one should have to make. No one should be compelled or coerced into taking any type of medical treatment as a condition of their employment.

Title VII of the Civil Rights Act and Title 1 of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) are both federal laws which require employers to make reasonable accommodations for employees regarding religious beliefs and medical reasons. Though obviously many employers are proceeding with vaccine mandates anyway, it is helpful to know that this precedent does exist in federal law.

Many employers provide an exemption process to those who object to receiving the vaccine. While I cannot give legal advice in my capacity as a legislator, there are some resources, guidance, and information available to individuals who choose to pursue a COVID-19 exemption request process at their place of work. I want to share this in case it is helpful to any individual facing a vaccine mandate from their employer, and if possible, I would recommend that anyone submitting such a request obtain private legal counsel before doing so. Remember to pay extremely close attention to the criteria your employer requires for an exemption process, and document everything for your own records as well.

Some legal organizations have assembled letter templates that may be used to help you write your exemption request. Keep in mind that you will still need to individualize your exemption request, rather than using one of these templates word-for-word.

If you choose to file a religious exemption, keep it simple and straight to the point. Now is not the time to elaborate on your concerns with mRNA technology and its effects on the human body, or anything along that line. Many individuals are avidly pro-life as a result of their religious beliefs, and it is no secret that the development of COVID-19 vaccines (along with many other vaccines) utilize cell lines from aborted fetuses, and that alone may be enough for many individuals to have a sincere objection to the vaccine. If you are pro-life, this may be a good basis for your religious or conscientious exemption request. If you can obtain a letter from your religious counselor or clergy, this will not hurt you. However, you do not need outside proof or confirmation of your personal beliefs.

Medical exemption requests differ in that they do require outside help from a health professional. You cannot write a medical exemption request on your own. If you have medical concerns about the COVID-19 vaccines, consider speaking with your physician. Some doctors may be willing to help you with your medical exemption if you have a condition or conditions that may make it hazardous for you to take a COVID-19 vaccine, such as heart problems, autoimmune disorders, allergies to certain vaccine ingredients, or even pregnancy, to name a few. If one physician denies your request for help, another physician may still be willing to help you with your medical exemption. You do not have to tell your employer that you spoke with multiple healthcare providers before obtaining what you needed.

If your exemption request is denied, you still have opportunity for recourse if you do so in a timely manner. If your religious exemption request is denied, file a complaint with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission

(EEOC). Employees in the private sector typically have 180 days to do this. Federal employees may be limited to 45 days.

Individuals who live in Texas may also want to file an Employment Discrimination Complaint with the Texas Workforce Commission.

Please note that there is no guarantee that using any of this advice will cause your employer to grant your exemption. This is simply information I have come across and want to share with anyone who may find it helpful. SREC UPDATE



The 4th quarterly meeting of the State Republican Executive Committee met on December 3 and 4 in San Marcos. The first order of business was to elect replacements for seven SREC members who resigned. The party Historian, Tim Westley, gave an informative history lesson on the Alamo. He reminded us to fight for the freedoms of the next generation. One voice – Remember the Alamo. Dr. Robin Armstrong, our Republican National Committeeman, spoke on the Pride Coalition controversy. Dr. Armstrong has filed to run for State Senator. He read 2nd Timothy, never make decisions out of fear.

State Chairman Matt Rinaldi announced the date of the State Convention for June 16, 2022, through June 18, 2022, in Houston. He also announced the formation of three special committees. The Local Government Special Committee was formed to assist counties with local elections. Vaccine Mandate Special Committee is working to get 4th special session to deal with Ban Vaccine Mandates. The Convention Contingency Special Committee was formed to come up with a plan if Houston refuses to let us have our convention there. If we can't go to Houston for our state convention, we will have our convention in our 31 Senatorial districts. The date for the contingency convention is set for July 28, 2022. Consideration of Rule 44 Resolutions from counties was postponed to after December 13.

The Resolutions Committee presented eight propositions to the SREC and two more were added at the general session. The Propositions that were passed and will be placed on the primary ballot are:

- 1. Border Security In light of the federal government's refusal to defend the southern border, Texas should immediately deploy the National Guard, Texas Military Forces, and necessary state law enforcement to seal the border, enforce immigrations laws, and deport illegal aliens.
- 2. Eliminate Property Tax Texas should eliminate all property taxes within ten (10) years without implementing a state income tax.
- 3. Vaccine Mandate Texans should not lose their job nor students be penalized for declining a COVID-19 vaccine.
- 4. Parents' Rights and Critical Race Theory Texas schools should teach students basic knowledge and American exceptionalism and reject Critical Race Theory and other curricula that promote Marxist doctrine and encourage division based on creed, race, or economic status.
- 5. Right To Life Texas should enact a State Constitutional Amendment to defend the sanctity of innocent human life, created in the image of God, from fertilization until natural death.
- 6. Committee Chairs The Republican-controlled Texas Legislature should end the practice of awarding committee chairmanships to Democrats.
- 7. Election Integrity Texas should protect the integrity of our elections by verifying that registered voters are American citizens, restoring felony penalties, and enacting civil penalties for voter fraud, and fighting any federal takeover of state elections.
- 8. Gender Modification Texas should ban chemical castration, puberty blockers, cross-sex hormones, and genital mutilation surgery on all minor children for sex transition purposes.
- 9. Parental Educational Relief Texas parents and guardians should have the right to select schools, whether public or private, for their children, and the funding should follow the student.
- 10. Freedom of Conscience Texans affirm that our freedoms come from God and that the government should have no control over the conscience of individuals.

The SREC passed three resolutions:

- 1. Uniform Submissions of County and Senatorial District Convention Reposts The SREC authorizes the RPT staff to specify a standard format and method of submission of all reports and exhibits originating from the 2022 County and Senatorial District conventions
- 2. Texas Association of School Boards (TASB) Affiliation The Republican Party of Texas firmly believes that local Independent School Districts (ISDs) should sever their ties with TASB in order to protect Texas children and the voices of parents.
- 3. Pride Coalition Formation The Republican Party of Texas does not believe that building GOP versions of left-wing movements furthers our cause and does not support this action by the Republican National Committee.

Rep. Holland encouraged that the end of Roe v. Wade, outlaw on abortion, May be near

The U.S. Supreme Court seems poised to roll back constitutional protections for abortion access, a decision that would have seismic impact in Texas and around the country. The court heard oral arguments Thursday in Dobbs v. Jackson, a case challenging Mississippi's 15-week abortion ban. Based on the arguments, the conservative majority on the court seemed likely to uphold the 15-week ban, which violates Roe v. Wade's constitutional protection for abortions before viability, usually around 24 weeks. It's not clear

whether the justices will entirely overturn the 1973 Supreme Court decision. A decision is expected next summer.

Holland to Serve As Vice Chair of Texas Sunset Commission

Last week, Representative Justin Holland was appointed to the Texas Sunset Advisory Commission and will serve as the House Chair. Among the state agencies under review for the 2022-2023 cycle are Electric Reliability Council (ERCOT), Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUCT), Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE) and Texas Water Development Board (TWDB).

Holland and House Colleagues Protest Biden Vaccine Mandates

In response and protest to President Joe Biden's OSHA Rule on COVID-19 vaccination and testing federal orders, Representative Justin Holland and over 80 of his colleagues have filed an amicus brief in the U.S. Court of Appeals 6th Circuit in conjunction with Texans for Responsible Government. Retired Teachers to Receive Thirteenth Check in January

Eligible Texas Teacher Retirement System (TRS) Retirees to Receive One-Time Supplemental Payment. The payment will go to eligible retirees and beneficiaries who retired before December 31, 2020, and will be up to \$2,400, or the amount of the retiree's annuity, whichever is less. Payments will be issued in January 2022. This timing will allow annuitants to make any necessary adjustments to their tax or financial planning for the 2022 tax year. The funds will come from the state's general fund and will be administered by the retirement system. TRS' Board of Trustees voted to approve the measure at the September 16-17 board meeting.

Rockwall ISD Art Teacher's Ornament to Hang On Texas Capitol Christmas Tree

This year, Rockwall ISD art teacher Amber Denton from Amy Parks-Heath Elementary School, was selected by Representative Holland to paint the ornament and represent District 33. Each year, members of the Texas House of Representatives are invited to select a constituent to create an ornament as a visual representation of what makes each Texas House District special. The ornaments are hung on a Texas-grown Christmas Tree that stands in the House Chamber of the Texas Capitol during the holiday season.
