

## Constitutional Amendments

Title	Subject	Description
Proposition 1	Gambling	Authorizes professional sports team charitable organizations to conduct raffles at rodeo venues
Proposition 2	Bond issues	Authorizes a county to issue bonds to fund infrastructure and transportation projects in undeveloped and blighted areas
Proposition 3	Religion	Amends the <a href="#">Texas Constitution</a> to prohibit the state or any political subdivision from enacting a law, rule, order, or proclamation that limits religious services or organizations
Proposition 4	State judiciary	Changes the eligibility requirements for the following judicial offices: a justice of the <a href="#">supreme court</a> , a judge of the <a href="#">court of criminal appeals</a> , a justice of a <a href="#">court of appeals</a> , and a <a href="#">district judge</a>
Proposition 5	State judiciary	Authorizes the <a href="#">Texas State Commission on Judicial Conduct</a> to accept and investigate complaints and reports against candidates running for state judicial office
Proposition 6	Healthcare and Constitutional rights	Amends the <a href="#">Texas Constitution</a> to state that residents of nursing facilities, assisted living facilities, or state-supported living centers have a right to designate an essential caregiver that may not be prohibited from visiting the resident
Proposition 7	Taxes	Amends the <a href="#">Texas Constitution</a> to allow the legislature to extend a homestead tax limit for surviving spouses of disabled individuals as long as the spouse is 55 years old and resides at the home
Proposition 8	Taxes and Veterans	Amends the <a href="#">Texas Constitution</a> to allow the legislature to apply a homestead tax exemption for surviving spouses of members of the military to those fatally injured in the line of duty

**October 17, 2021 is National Pasta Day**

Feel free to celebrate this fun day by exploring the world of pasta. Prepare a fun dish with all the delicious flavors and textures that comes with the many types of noodles. I have included a tasty yet easy pasta sauce for you to try.

Crushed tomatoes – diced tomatoes work but the consistency will be a little off. Start the sauce by adding ¼ cup of water. Always keep in mind if your sauce is thick to add more water. The sauce will thicken as it cooks so you want the sauce thinner to start. Onions and garlic bring a lot of flavor to the sauce. Add 3- 5 cloves of garlic, why the range? If you have smaller cloves use 5. Add 1 diced medium onion. The thicker you dice the onions the thicker the sauce. Add a pat of butter and mix into your sauce. Add fresh or dried basil to your liking into the sauce. This sauce only requires 10 minutes of simmering. If you want a deeper flavor cook it longer. Feel free to add a pinch of salt and a sprinkle of red pepper flakes. You can even add additional herbs, like oregano, or add grated parmesan at the end of the cooking. It's your sauce, experiment how you want and add to your favorite pasta. Enjoy!

**ROCKWALL COUNTY UPDATE**



As anyone who lives in Rockwall County can attest to, one of the biggest concerns facing fast growing Rockwall County is quite simply being stuck in traffic. The Rockwall County Commissioners Court unanimously approved a \$150 million road bond option that will be on the ballot in November of this year. Rockwall County worked with each city in the county to identify the projects most critical to relieving the congestion and further prepare for growth in each community. Once a draft was compiled, the county met with the North Central Texas Council of Governments and the Texas Department of Transportation to identify which projects had the best potential for partnership leveraging. In 2004, Rockwall County voters approved \$17 million and in 2008, \$100 million were approved. To date, Rockwall County Commissioners, working with partners have utilized the proceeds from the 2004 and 2008 road bond programs to fund and construct more than \$1 billion

in roadway projects throughout the county that have significantly improved the quality of life of every resident. To see the list of projects identified as well as other details on the bond proposal, please go to [RockwallCountyTrip21.com](http://RockwallCountyTrip21.com).

In December of 2020, Rockwall County lost the senior member of the Commissioners Court as County Commissioner David Magness passed away suddenly from a heart attack. Rockwall County and each of the cities of Fate, Rockwall and Royse City all passed a resolution requesting the renaming of State Highway 66 throughout all of Rockwall County to be named the David Magness Memorial Highway. State Senator Bob Hall and State Representative Justin Holland both filed legislation designating the renaming that was unanimously approved by both the house and senate. I would like to invite everyone to attend the ceremony unveiling of the signage that will be held on October 29<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am. I will send out specific location details as they are made available but for now, mark it on your calendar to attend.

It truly is an honor serving as the Rockwall County Judge, a position I do not take for granted.

**ROCKWALL ISD UPDATE**

**Rockwall Independent School District – Upcoming Bond Election**

To prepare for the increasing student population, the RISD Board of Trustees took a community-driven approach to prioritizing the District’s future needs and commissioned a Facilities Bond Committee. The Facilities Bond Committee of parents, grandparents, teachers and students, along with community and business leaders, developed a \$475.8 million bond proposal that impacts every student and every school in Rockwall ISD.

**Proposition A** - would provide \$458,926,000 million dollars for new schools and renovations and additions to current schools in response to our growth.

**Proposition B** - would allocate \$16,919,000 million to update technology infrastructure, purchase new computers and chromebooks, provide classroom interactive multimedia displays and enhance wifi connectivity for classrooms.

**ROCKWALL COUNTY ELECTIONS**



**Rockwall County Countywide Polling Program**

Earlier this year, Rockwall County Elections Administrator Chris Lynch appeared before the Commissioners Court to seek approval to apply to the State for acceptance into the Countywide Polling Program. The Court voted to allow it and two subsequent public hearings were held to listen to concerns from voters.

This past week, Lynch was informed that Rockwall County had been accepted. Lynch went on to say, “this will fundamentally change the way we vote in this county.”

Voters will still be assigned a precinct, but on Election Day, voters will be able to vote wherever they want as opposed to voting at a specific location. This action also facilitates getting out of schools. Schools that will no longer be used include Nebbie Williams, Cullins-Lake Pointe, Dorris Jones, Amanda Rochelle, and Pullen Elementary. New locations include Rockwall County Library, City Center (Rockwall), Rockwall Area Chamber of Commerce, and the Gene Burton College & Career Academy. Over 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of the counties in the State of Texas participate in the program.


