LEGISLATION



Thank you, State Representative Holland, for the following information:

Updates from Justin Holland:

House Bill 2622 has been placed on the Major State Calendar for Thursday, April 29, 2021; known as the Second Amendment Sanctuary State Act, the bill would: "forbid Texas state agencies & local governments from enforcing new federal gun laws or rules."

Border security and immigration reform is the #1 issue that I hear about in my office from constituents. This session, we passed a budget that prioritizes our state's obligation to protecting Texas communities by putting State Troopers on highways, boots on the border, human trafficking prevention programs, anti-gang

programs, cameras, drones, aircraft, boats, intelligence technology, border prosecutors and investigators.

There is a high likelihood that most drugs on the streets in Texas are coming across our border. Marijuana, cocaine, meth, fentanyl, heroine and other opioids all are picked up in seizures each week by DPS.

House Bill 958 by Dr. Tom Oliverson would put Texas on the path to eliminating School M&O property taxes. Taxes are consistently among the top five concerns of my constituents.

We have just over three weeks left in the 87th Texas Legislative Session for our Legislative Priorities to make it through the process, but we are experiencing a *serious* bottleneck. You can see by reading the captions for the bills below that it is important we succeed this session. Your actions can make *all* the difference right now!

ACTION ITEM 1:

At this moment, there are 14 RPT Legislative Priority bills stalled in the Calendars Committee. Yes, you read that right! Contact the Calendars Committee Chairman Dustin Burrows to ask that he bring *all* these priority bills up for a Committee vote along with contacting Committee members to ask them to vote these bills favorably out of Committee.

ACTION ITEM 2:

If you can believe it, seven priority bills are stalled in the House State Affairs Committee! This is unacceptable. Please contact House State Affairs Committee Chairman Chris Paddie to implore him to add these bills to the committee hearing agenda ASAP.

- Ask Chairman Paddie to be bring these up for a House State Affairs Committee vote:

ACTION ITEM 3:

Please contact your Texas State Senator and ask them to vote *for* these priority bills. Ask your Senator to vote *YES* to protect our children!

- SB 1311, relating to the provision of and professional liability insurance coverage for gender transitioning or gender reassignment medical procedures and treatments for certain children, is scheduled to be heard on the Senate floor tomorrow (Tuesday, May 4, 2021).
- SB 8, the 'Heartbeat' bill, is scheduled to be heard on the Senate floor Wednesday, May 5, 2021.

With your help, we can get these priorities over the finish line but it will take us all making calls and sending emails. Please *share* this information with your clubs, groups, etc. Thank you for all your work this session and we pray God's blessing and favor on these important pieces of legislation to protect our freedoms and our children.

WHERE IS THE COMPASSION PRESIDENT BIDEN?

Since Inauguration Day we've heard from commentators, celebrities, and liberal friends who believe that America now has a compassionate president, an affable Washington insider who is moderate and who plays by the rules and gets along with the media. Under this administration, they will not have to deal with outrageous ideas such as increasing prosperity by cutting taxes and reducing regulations, hold the Chinese accountable on their trade policies by enforcing tariffs and bringing American jobs back to our shores, enforce

our borders and work with other countries to control the flow of migrants or champion energy independence instead of crusading to eliminate fossil fuels. Under this administration, America First will be discarded.

Outrageous to them is the notion that America is an imperfect but essentially good country founded on good principles and whose President puts its interests first. Instead, they demand an America where globalism, socialism, and wokeism are paramount and our interests come last.

The first 100 days of the Biden Administration have proven themselves to be anything but compassionate and have put Americans last.

Within minutes of his inauguration, President Biden signed an executive order cancelling the construction of the Keystone Pipeline. Is it compassionate to kill over 11,000 jobs, including 8,000 union jobs, and let energy prices soar for working Americans? Is it compassionate to try to sell people on a \$2.25 trillion "infrastructure" plan when only 7% of the funding is for roads, bridges, waterways, ports, and airports?

President Trump faced endless criticism for taking a tough stance on immigration and border security. President Biden promised a more compassionate approach. Now our facilities on the border are dangerously overcrowded with thousands of migrants illegally crossing into the U.S. every day, many of whom are unaccompanied children. Human trafficking is rampant, and many migrants are being released into the community with neither proper testing nor treatment for COVID-19. Neither President Biden nor Vice President Harris, appointed to handle the crisis, have yet visited the border let alone come up with a solution on how to handle it. Compassion is definitely lacking when the only ones celebrating are the human traffickers and drug dealers.

As for the COVID-19 pandemic, then candidates Biden and Harris were skeptical about the COVID-19 vaccine and its effectiveness, cautioning everyone to "follow the science." It was the Trump Administration that put together Operation Warp Speed to assist scientists and drug makers in rapidly developing a vaccine and to create

a distribution plan. Now President Biden's compassionate response is to take all the credit for Operation Warp Speed and put forth a COVID relief package that, like his infrastructure plan, includes very little to fight the coronavirus but lavishes spending on for Democrat pet projects. As for returning to normalcy in school, President Biden is more concerned with placating the powerful teachers' unions than showing concern for our children's health and well-being and their education. We could be dealing with the fallout from our children and the emotional scars for years.
