With the Primaries over, it is imperative now more than ever to remind our community members that we have 2 more elections coming up and we will need them to get back out to vote.

Up first, we have the Municipal Elections starting with early voting April 22-30, 2024 and Election Day being Saturday, May 4, 2024. This election will cover the Rockwall ISD School Board Trustees, City of Fate Council Members, City of Heath Mayor and Council Members, City of McLendon-Chisholm Mayor and Council Members, City of Wylie Council Members and City of Rowlett Propositions.

Next, we will need to ensure everyone gets back out for the Runoff Election, with early voting starting May 20-24, 2024 and Election Day being Tuesday, May 28, 2024. This election will cover State Representative, District 33 and County Commissioner Precinct 1. Regardless if you live in a specific area, as you can see the Rockwall ISD and State Representative races effect us all. Please make it a point to go vote and take someone with you. Out of the 83,500 registered voters in Rockwall County, only 22,593 people got out to vote. That is 27.06% of our county (both Republican and Democrats). That is a truly sad representation of our community. Men fought and some lost their lives



We as women should truly take a stand to ensure our families and friends are out casting their vote. When the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was passed on June 4, 1919, and ratified on August 18, 1920, women across the nation made a point to go and vote. Path to the Founders' Vision

America's Founding Fathers formed our nation to be a bastion of liberty that would outlast even the longest of empires. Their vision told the story of a nation reliant on Natural Law to govern the affairs of men. The Founders intended to form a nation that was virtuous and morally superior, with leaders who held themselves to this same standard. These men were strong in their conviction to build a just nation filled with people of great character.

What the Founders understood that to be was a "City on a Hill" as John Winthrop described in his 1630 sermon. The nation needed to operate under traditional Judeo-Christian values. For the idea of this great nation, one where all mankind is created equal, to succeed, religion and morality must become the support system that maintains righteous government. Righteous government cannot exist unless it is, as President Abraham Lincoln said, "of the people, by the people, and for the people."

Government today continues to stray further from the vision our Founders laid out some 247 years ago at the signing of the Declaration of Independence. Our inability to uphold a virtuous and morally superior society has led to many of our leaders being morally corrupt and seeking personal gain rather than leading this nation with great character. We have seen a top-down erosion of character and morality in government leaders who no longer hold the Founders' vision for our nation in high regard. They instead see public office as an opportunity to gain fame and line their pockets.

Societal decay has reared its head due to low levels of trust in institutions, among other factors. This lack of trust can be traced back to a lack of virtue in society and among its leaders. President Ronald Reagan, in his farewell address to a grateful nation, spoke at length regarding the need for limited government. He specifically stated, "As government expands, liberty contracts."

This concept was the catalyst for the ratification of the Tenth Amendment which conveys that any powers not specifically given to the federal government, nor withheld from the states, are reserved to those respective states, or **to the people**. The Founders understood the need to enshrine limited and carefully defined powers, not to protect the government from the people, but to protect the people from an overreaching government.

While the Tenth Amendment is pure in its intention, it has been ignored by those in power for far too long. Today, we see a federal government that consistently exercises power it does not hold according to the Constitution while at the same time abdicating duties it is charged with such as protecting our nation's border. Federal government today is far removed from the picture President Lincoln painted in the Gettysburg Address, it no longer operates "of the people, by the people, and for the people," but rather **despite the people.** Leaders are focused on maximizing power rather than protecting the individual rights of the people.

The path is clear either continue down the road of societal decay, or turn back to the vision of the Founders. Seek out virtue and morality, and vote for leaders who hold these traits in the highest regard. For our nation to thrive, we must choose the vision of the Founders and we must choose quickly.
