

The Department of Veteran Affairs and the Department of Defense estimate that 20 former or current service members die by suicide a day. This is simply unacceptable.


It was my honor to sponsor and pass to the Governor's desk Representative Lopez's HCR 12, recognizing September 22 as Texas Veterans Suicide Prevention Day. This is a positive step in bringing more awareness to the hardships our men and women in uniform face on a daily basis.

HOTEXAS USE REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT 33

IT PASSED!

As a girl dad, I love supporting my daughters. I want them, and all girls, to have a fair playing field. This legislation upholds the integrity of women's sports and stops the unconstitutional precedent being set by other states that allow biological men to compete in women's collegiate sports.





This week, I also passed two companion Senate bills out of the House and two bills out of the Senate that are headed to the Governor's desk to receive his signature!

I also had my first bill of the session signed by the Governor this week! Senate Bill 1322 is a companion to House Bill 3350 which creates a process to allow Texas to sell these vintage distilled spirits to a package store and then allows the package store to market and sell vintage distilled spirits. This bill cuts through unnecessary regulatory red tape and ensures Texans can enjoy vintage distilled spirits in a free market. Thank you to Governor Abbott for signing this bill into Texas law.

I look forward to continuing to see the House Bills I filed make their way through the Senate and sponsor Senate bills for passage through the House floor over the last week of the legislative session.

Below are some highlights of some of the legislation I passed this week:

HB 697 -

House Bill 697, which requires certain fuel gas piping to be listed on a Seller's Disclosure Form in the home buying process, was passed through the Senate and is on its way to the Governor's desk.

My office has worked on this critical piece of legislation over multiple sessions. I am grateful to my House colleagues for ensuring this legislation received early committee hearings and calendar referrals to increase its chance of becoming law. Thank you to Ms. Becky Teel for working with me on this legislation which personally impacted her and in memory of her son, Brennan Teel.

HB 1195 -

House Bill 1195, which grants counties the authority to require photo identification to property documents with the county clerk, was passed through the Senate and is on its way to the Governor's desk.

HB 1195 combats criminal deed fraud and ensures that our vulnerable populations are safeguarded from deed fraudsters. Thank you once again to Rockwall County Clerk Jennifer Fogg for bringing this matter to our attention and helping us pass this important legislation.

STATE REPUBLICAN EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE



Update on the 88th Legislative session. The GOP Legislative Priorities voted on by our delegates to the 2022 state convention were what we were most interested in. We were determined to protect our children. We were successful with many bills headed to Governor Abbott's desk for his signature include SB14 -Banning gender modification on minors, HB900 - Restricting sexually explicit and adult-designated educational resources from school libraries, SB12 – Prohibiting drag queen story events in municipal libraries, on public property, on the premises of a commercial enterprise, or in the presence of a child. Other passed bills include: SB29 - Prohibiting implementation or enforcement of a vaccine mandate, mask requirement to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Senate bill 1070 passed; Allowing Texas to withdraw from the Electronic Registration Information Center, also known as ERIC, a multistate program used for checking voter registrations and cleaning voter rolls (a George Soros program).

The bills to secure the border were passed; increasing the powers of arrest, search and seizure for Border Patrol Agents, Directing the Governor to enter an interstate compact with one or more states for Border Security. It appears that no bills were passed defending our gun rights. There were many more that went through hours of debate, amendments, and readings.
