



### V.P. PROGRAMS





# SOCIAL CHAIR




Thank you all who came out to Pablo's for our March Social Hour. It was raining but the tacos, chips and salsa were delicious.

The Senate Tax Relief Plan, composed of Senate Bills 3, 4, and 5, will put more money back in the pockets of all taxpayers. These property tax bills will provide an astounding \$16.5 billion in tax relief for Texans. With this package, 5.72 million homesteads will save nearly \$800 a year.

SB 3 was signed by all 31 senators as Joint Authors and will raise the Homestead Exemption 75% to \$70,000 for 5.72 million homeowners. SB 3 will also implement the voter-approved Homestead Exemption increase from \$25,000 to \$40,000 for all over-65 and disabled homesteads from Propositions 1 and 2 in May of 2022. This \$100,000 exemption in total, for seniors that have paid a lifetime of taxes, saves them over \$1,000 per year.

SB 4 will provide \$5.38 billion to compress ISD tax rates an additional 7.03 pennies. This bill also reduces recapture by expanding the finance equity band to 20%. The reduction in the Maximum Compression Rate (MCR) limitation will allow more school districts that are clustered at the MCR floor to reduce their tax rates further, thereby reducing the amount of recapture they pay.

SB 5 will create an Inventory Tax Credit totaling \$1.05 billion. This bill will raise the Business Personal Property Exemption to \$25,000 from \$2,500, saving \$450 million. It will also cut business compliance costs, therefore saving businesses more money - the final element in the Senate plan.

SJR 3, SJR 4, and SJR 5 were rolled into one Constitutional Amendment that voters will vote on during the November 2023 General Election. If approved by voters, the Senate's unprecedented Property Tax Relief Plan consisting of SB 3, SB 4, and SB 5 will go into effect.

God Bless Texas!!!

The Senate Tax Plan has received support from all over the state and from tax professionals such as the Texas Taxpayers Research Association, Texas Public Policy Foundation, and the Texas Association of Property Tax Professionals.

Texas Senate Republicans have been working diligently to pass legislation that will provide unprecedented tax relief worth \$15 Billion to homeowners and ALL taxpayers.
